This work is inextricably linked with our day-to-day objective to drive the cost-effectiveness and deliver the efficiencies we know are vital to our customers.


Looking back

New partnerships

Over the past 12 months we have been privileged to be appointed by a number of new customers to provide a range of health and care systems support services. This has generated £78m in new business.

Becoming a strategic partner to Norfolk and Waveney CCGs

Our two new contracts began on 1 April 2018 with five CCGs across Norfolk and Waveney – North Norfolk, South Norfolk, West Norfolk, Great Yarmouth and Waveney, and Norwich.

The first contract covers end to end commissioning support (business intelligence, procurement and provider management, finance, human resources, information governance and freedom of information) and information technology support (GP and corporate IT). The second contract covers medicines management and optimisation, and individual funded request support.



Running the learning network for the Global Digital Exemplar (GDE) programme

Our digital transformation team has developed, and is continuing to support, a learning network for the GDE programme on behalf of NHS England. The network is enabling information sharing and learning to be transferred between the sites and across the wider health system.

Providing business intelligence services to the Advancing Quality Alliance (AQuA)

Our business intelligence team was appointed by AQuA to design and develop a new clinical measures data collection system which allows for the capture, processing and reporting of measures relating to evidence based clinical intervention standards.

Preparing to deliver in Essex

Winners in the patient data category for our work to develop a risk stratification solution, based on the Johns Hopkins ACG system, which helps organisations predict behaviours, such as unplanned admissions, and intervene earlier to improve patient experience and reduce the burden on emergency care.

We were also delighted to be shortlisted for the HSJ Value in Healthcare Awards, HCSA Awards, and Patient Safety Awards for our projects to transform care for people with learning disabilities and autism in Coventry, Warwickshire and Solihull; and to develop an Atrial Fibrillation template to support GPs with decision-making and help prevent stroke admissions.
